Once we receive the donations from each grade level, we will pack the shoeboxes *(turn page over for grade level details)*. Students bringing in donations will be entered into a drawing for a chance to be able to participate in the "wrap party" to get the gifts wrapped and ready for pick-up on December 19th.
